Each year we identify and raise funds for justice causes by hosting music, arts, and educational events. Our concerts and public forums help us amplify the issues, educate the public, and move people to action.

Since 2013, JusticeAid has presented more than three dozen concert artists and granted 100% of the ticket revenues and other contributions to 18 nonprofits that are working to ensure access to justice and civil rights for everyone.

Our 2026 grantee partner, the National Immigration Project, works to advance and protect the rights of all immigrants.
